Crime Rates

Bideford Street Pastors continue to have a positive effect on reducing crime rates

Devon & Cornwall Police recently produced a report for the year ending 31 March 2010 referring specifically to the times we patrol and compared with the previous year:

All Crimes

Force Area -7.3% Bideford Town Centre -42.6% Violence

Force Area -1.2% Bideford Town Centre -43.9% Anti-Social Behaviour

Force Area -9.8% Bideford Town Centre -26.8% <u>Damage</u>

Force Area -12.4% Bideford Town Centre -32.4%

The report continues: "It is important to stress that these police figures reflect only a part of the picture and do not show the increase in public reassurance..... They do not reflect the overwhelming appreciation from police officers, taxi drivers and licensees..... Nor do they reflect the personal impact on the lives of individuals...."
